Fuel poverty affects one in nine families in London, with those living in deprived areas MORE likely to experience cold, damp homes. I've taken a number of steps to mitigate this including through my Fuel Poverty Partnership as part of my £34m Energy for Londoners programme. My 'Warmer Homes Advice Service' has also successfully assisted more than 7,500 households and has improved the energy efficiency of more than 1,400 homes. I've also been working with London boroughs and housing associations to secure more investment in addressing fuel poverty and making London's housing more energy efficient which will help an additional 1000 homes.

London's 3.5 million homes are responsible for around one third of the city's greenhouse gas emissions. My Green New Deal to make London a zero-carbon city by 2030 puts the environment and tackling fuel poverty at the centre of our recovery by retrofitting ageing and energy-inefficient housing to create warm, affordable and ultra-low carbon homes. This programme will save thousands of tonnes of CO2 a year and will tackle fuel poverty by making homes warmer and more affordable.

If I'm re-elected on 6 May, I will continue my work to make London carbon-neutral by 2030 through my Green New Deal, campaign for rent controls and stand up for Londoners to ensure they live in warm and affordable homes."
